

Introduction

For the first time in our nation's history, the Federal Government has made it a goal that 40 percent of the overall benefits of certain Federal investments flow to disadvantaged communities that are marginalized, underserved, and overburdened by pollution.

President Biden made this historic commitment when he signed Executive Order 14008, <u>Tackling the Climate Crisis</u> <u>at Home and Abroad</u> within days of taking office.

By this order, President Biden made climate and environmental justice center points of his policy agenda for this country's future.

Primary goal: Environmental Justice for All

Section 223 has come to be called the Justice 40 Initiative -- or just plain "Justice 40"

It requires that 40 percent of benefits from specific investment flow to disadvantaged communities.



Things to know:

The tool uses census tracts a. Census tracts are a small unit of geography. They generally have populations at of between 1,200 - 8,000 people.


Communities that are disadvantaged live in tracts that experience burdens. These tracts are highlighted \bigcirc on the map.

The tool ranks most of the burdens using percentiles \triangle . Percentiles show how much burden each tract experiences when compared to other tracts.





TO HELP PRIORITIZE DISADVANTAGED COMMUNITIES FOR PROGRAMS COVERED UNDER JUSTICE40, EPA:

Program modifications

- Developed resources for states revising their definitions and affordability criteria through the <u>Clean Water State Revolving Fund</u> (CWSRF) and <u>Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF)</u>, <u>Water</u> <u>Infrastructure Improvements for the Nation (WIIN)</u>, and BIL funding.
- Engaged with various State Revolving Fund partners to prioritize disadvantaged communities;
- Iaunched technical assistance pilots for these communities: Coachella Valley (California), Hawaii County (Hawaii), Kauai County (Hawaii), and Gila County (Arizona); and increased support to American Samoa, the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, and Guam.

LAUNCHED NEW GRANT DELIVERY NETWORK: DELIVERING ACCESS

TCTACS: 17 total, 14 regional and 3 nationals (I of the nationa CTACS is focused on assistance for tribes)
